Catherine Evans



Nick Andrews

Nick is a Registered Social Worker and Research and Practice Development Officer in Swansea University, where he co-ordinates the Developing Evidence Enriched Practice (DEEP) programme. The focus of this work is a co-production approach to using diverse types of evidence in learning and development using story and dialogue methods. Having spent many years in practice and planning in social care services, he is able to make connections between research, policy and practice and has developed an extensive network across Wales and the UK. He is passionate about supporting a shift from process-driven to relationship-centred practice.





Donna Sharland

Donna is a neurodiversity specialist and managing director of the company AutSiDe Education and Consultancy Ltd. Based in South Wales, she is a qualified teacher and a passionate advocate for the neurodivergent community, which is reflected in her professional and research work. As managing director, Donna Sharland runs this award-winning company, which provides training, consultancy, and support for neurodiversity and related conditions. AutSiDe is neurodivergent-led, and all of its services are intrinsically shaped by autistic perspectives. The company works with both families and organizations across the UK and internationally. Donna Sharland is an associate tutor in criminology and policing and she serves as a trustee for Autism Life centres a non-profit organisation that offers specialist day services for autistic adults and young people with complex health needs.







Lisa Hammett & Anna Reis-Rogers

Lisa and Ana have lived experience and both have lost a loved one to suicide. Recognising the vulnerability of those bereaved by suicide and the difficulty of finding support in West Wales, they co-founded LiSS with Sian Retter. LiSS a peer support group based in Ceredigion, Pembrokeshire and Carmarthenshire, providing a walk in service where people can be seen, heard, and cared for. Together, they have received multiple awards, including the Volunteer Award at the West Wales Health and Care Awards.

They have trained various organisations, such as SOBS, ASIST, Papyrus, Time for Change, Sandy Bear, and Jacob Abraham, to provide a deeper understanding of suicide. Their participation includes projects such as training with Dyfed-Powys Police and creating resources, including "Help at Hand" and NHS suicide prevention training. Their goal is to engage those bereaved by suicide and facilitate conversations that help break the stigma surrounding suicide and mental health. With their lived experience and specialist insight from supporting over 70 families bereaved by suicide, this session will support discussion regarding the impact and cost of suicide for the community, for those bereaved and aim to create safe spaces and foster resilience within the community.
