Working together to prevent child sexual abuse

Over the last year **Stop It Now! Wales** has been busy making new resources for parents, carers and professionals, as well as updating existing ones, to ensure that adults have the support and advice they need to prevent child sexual abuse.

Who we are

Since 2008, we've been working across Wales with local authorities, safeguarding boards, police forces, the Welsh government, voluntary organisations, and families and communities to prevent child sexual abuse.

Our anonymous Stop It Now! helpline, secure messaging service and live chat give the public and professionals a confidential place to discuss concerns about child sexual abuse. We work with adults worried about:

- their own thoughts or behaviour, offline and online
- the offline or online behaviour of another adult
- a child or young person's offline or online sexual behaviour.

Alongside our helpline, hundreds of thousands have used our **self-help resources** to get help managing their thoughts and behaviours, both online and offline.

Why we need your help

Sexual abuse affects around 1 in 6 children across the UK. Our resources and training help parents, carers and professionals know what they can do to protect children from harm. We can support you if you have concerns about an adult or child. We can also help if something has already happened. Raising awareness of these resources is vital in order to protect children from harm and stop people from offending.

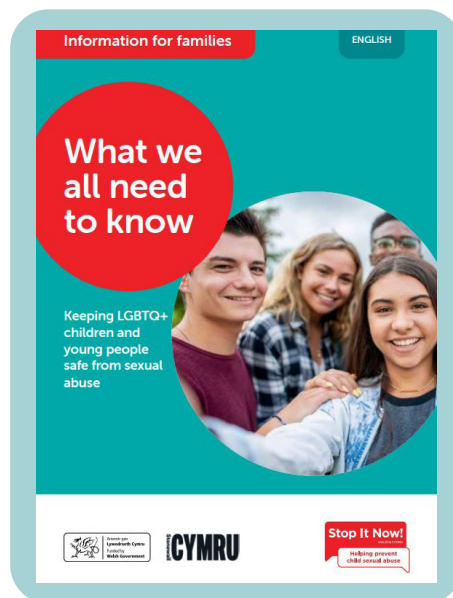
Our resources for parents, carers and professionals

What we all need to know leaflets

Our 'What we all need to know' leaflets contain vital information on how to protect children from sexual abuse. They have advice on how to prevent harm, how to spot warning signs, in both adults and children, and where to go to get further support.

Some children are more vulnerable to sexual abuse, including children from minority ethnic backgrounds, those with learning difficulties (both children and parents) or LGBTQ+ children and young people. That's why we worked with Ethnic Minorities and Youth Support (EYST), Learning Disability Wales (LDW), and Stonewall Cymru to make the leaflets.

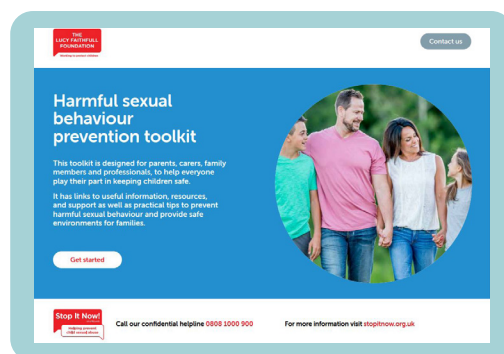

Harmful sexual behaviour prevention guide

Around one third of child sexual abuse is carried out by under 18s. That's why we made a guide for parents, carers and professionals to help understand what harmful sexual behaviour looks like in children and young people and how to create a safe environment for families.

Our experienced advisors support anyone worried about child sexual abuse prevention, and can help professionals with specific cases or with general information on child safety.



We also help anyone concerned about their own or another adult or young person's thoughts, feelings and behaviour towards children, as well as anyone concerned about a child or young person. You can ask to speak to our advisors in both English and Welsh.
